Background

As a manager, a Principal has to plan, organise, control and mobilise resources and energise all in the college to work in teams and collaborate with each other to achieve the stated goals. Therefore, a Principal will be able to discharge this dual role effectively only when he or she possesses leadership traits and managerial abilities.

The success and credibility of colleges are often correlated with competent, enthusiastic, and energized Principals. Not only this, college Principals are supposed to develop institutions of excellence in the wake of changes occurring in the educational scenario at the national and global level. College Principals are destined to act as a catalyst for nurturing national values and ethos among learners and preparing them as future leaders to lead an inclusive, equitable, and sustainable society. The role of college Principals becomes more significant in fulfilling the expectations of National Education Policy 2020. NEP 2020 requires college principals to create world-class multidisciplinary institutions, increase the Gross Enrolment Ratio to 50% by 2035, and promote holistic and multidisciplinary education. Above all, NEP 2020 requires that the colleges will seek support and guidance in achieving the minimum benchmarks for achieving the status of 'Autonomous Degree Granting Colleges'.

To support the college Principals in the mammoth task of revamping and transforming education in their colleges, University of Kashmir is organizing a Leadership Capacity Building Programme for College Principals of our affiliated colleges. The programme is aimed to develop leadership and management capabilities of College Principals so as assist them to excel, both personally and professionally, in their roles.

Programme Objectives

The primary objective of the programme is to build leadership and managerial capabilities of principals of our affiliated colleges so as to enable them to manage their colleges well to meet the demands of NEP 2020 and new knowledge economy. The specific objectives of the programme include:

- To sensitize the Principals about various Leadership challenges in higher Education and the strategies needed to meet such challenges.
- To train how to design and implement a 'Strategic Plan (ISP)' of the college.
- To educate how to plan, develop and implement 'College Development Plan (IDP)'.
- To highlight the steps needed to mobilize resources and create an eco-system for quality-driven outcome-based education in their colleges.
- To make them understand about the niceties of planning and organising 'Academic & Administrative Audit (AAA)' at the College Level.
- To discuss the best practices needed to achieve excellence in higher education at the college level.

The group work will conclude with the preparation of a document/ plan of action. The purpose of the group work is to provide 'Hand-on-Training' to the participants.
